Additional Background about the L&C National Park Association

Our mission is to promote Lewis and Clark National Historical Park and enhance the public's understanding of the Lewis and Clark Expedition and its significance. We are a volunteer board of directors who together with our Executive Director and employees, manage and oversee the Fort Clatsop Bookstore located inside Fort Clatsop Visitor Center. Funds from our operation are dedicated to and used in support of our mission.

Our purpose is to provide support and assistance to the interpretative, educational, scientific, and historical projects and activities of the Park Service. Some of our contributions to the Park Service have included:

- Donating sales proceeds from prized art pieces, such as the "Arrival" bronze by Stanley Wanlass,
- Expanding park boundaries by purchasing land for "Netul Landing" and "Fort to Sea Trail" and then donating them to the Park,
- Funding of items for the Park's research library, and
- Numerous educational activities, related artifacts and supplies such as "Traveling Trunks"

The last upgrade to the park visitor center (Fort Clatsop) occurred when the park was 124.9 acres. Over the past 30 years, we have witnessed tremendous growth to L&C National Historical Park. Annual visitation has increased to roughly 293,000 a year. The park has expanded to 3,410 acres and provides visitors a unique experience of the flora and fauna that existed during Lewis and Clark's winter stay and their explorations north & south of the Columbia River at the Pacific Ocean.
